

I don't quite recall how I cam across this book (probably at a book fair, a Hebrew edition). What enticed me was the foreword by Borges, who had been very much influenced by Schwob. Since I am a huge fan of Borges, I bought it.

However, for this particular reader it was a case of unfulfilled expectations. I've read 6 out of the 22 pieces so far and frankly I have little desire to go on. I do certainly feel an affinity to Borges's style (for example, his story "The Circular Ruins" or many others) but the mood is somehow to dark and too decadent for me. I failed to empathize with the characters the way I do with those of Borges.

Maybe I'll pick it up again at some point in the future. But right now I am putting the book away, to my own chagrin.
